

BEDWYN TRAINS PASSENGER GROUP'S ROUTE UTILISATION RESPONSE

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Introduction

This work, including a proposed timetable, has been produced by the Bedwyn Trains Passenger Group (BTPG) in connection with a submission to the consultation stage of the Route Utilisation Strategy for the Great Western area.

Ideal Solution

The perfect solution for the users of Bedwyn trains would be for a Monday to Saturday hourly service east, and an hourly service west, from 0600 to midnight with peak time, departing and arriving, eastbound Monday to Friday trains being half hourly. The eastbound trains would, having originated from the west, in addition to calling at Bedwyn, call at Hungerford, Kintbury, Newbury, Thatcham, Theale, Reading and Paddington. The westbound trains would originate from Paddington and call at Reading, Theale, Thatcham, Newbury, Kintbury, Hungerford, Bedwyn, Pewsey and Westbury with about half the trains running on to Exeter, calling at suitable intermediate stations on route. The Monday to Friday service would include a Bedwyn departure at around 0800 to provide the 'school run' to Newbury with an appropriately timed late afternoon train back from Newbury. Additionally services would be timed to allow a 0900 start to a working day at Newbury, Thatcham, Theale and Reading to the east with Westbury, Bath, Bristol, Taunton and Exeter to the west. The Sunday service would be similar to a Saturday service though two hourly not hourly.

We understand that this would likely necessitate a rolling stock refresh and is therefore likely to be economically unviable.

An alternative approach, to the westbound connectivity issue, is to, instead of regarding Bedwyn and its turn back siding as out of place, embrace it by making Bedwyn an interchange station for off peak westbound connections for Kintbury and Hungerford. This would involve timing the semi-fast services (starting or ending their journey at Frome, Westbury, Taunton or Exeter) such that they call at Bedwyn (and not Hungerford or Kintbury) and to align them with the services starting or terminating at Bedwyn. Therefore passengers from Kintbury and Hungerford, heading west, would change at Bedwyn to pick up the semi-fast westbound service and Hungerford and Kintbury passengers, returning from the west, would change at Bedwyn onto the locally connecting service.

This scheme could be extended to include Theale and Thatcham such that the semi-fast off peak services would only stop at Newbury, Bedwyn and Pewsey on the run between Reading and Westbury.

However we realise these ideas could cause conflicts with the needs of other passengers, stations and routes. Therefore for the rest of this report we have adopted a pragmatic approach to improve the service on the Bedwyn line which is less radical and does not conflict with services running currently east of Reading and west of Westbury.

About Bedwyn Trains Passenger Group

The Bedwyn Trains Passenger Group was set up in 2006 to fight the proposed cuts to our service. Before the proposed cuts we had 20 eastbound trains and 19 back and nothing to or from the west. The proposal was to reduce us to 14 eastbound trains and 14 back.

Our successes are:

- Through campaigning we have increased the service to 22 out and 22 back including services to and from the west
- Resolving the poor weekday evening connecting service from Paddington
- A September to May Saturday westbound service
- Improving the Monday to Friday westbound service
- Resolving the two hour Saturday evening gap
- Resolving the two hour Monday to Friday lunchtime gap back to Bedwyn
- Resolving of the two hour Saturday lunchtime gap for trains from the east
- Including Pewsey on our timetable book. Previously Pewsey was omitted even though some of our services call there
- Getting Bedwyn station back on a mini timetable booklet (this is the timetable D6)
- Re-establishment of the Marlborough buses on the train timetable
- Improved seating on the westbound platform.
- Being supplied with timetables to distribute to local residents
- Fare easement for the 0840
- Station was repainted and repairs carried out.
- Station Adoption
- Getting notice boards, on both platforms, so we can advertise the service and provide useful information
- Negotiated better alignment of the Marlborough bus with the rail timetable
- Along with other campaign groups we contributed to the argument that successfully got the 1706 and 1806 weekday Paddington departures reclassified for off peak fares

Aside from topics covered elsewhere in this document we continue to campaign for:

- Promotion of our service in and around the Bedwyn and Marlborough area
- Improved punctuality, reliability and seating capacity
- Improved holding of trains at Newbury, or additional services from Newbury, if the incoming London connection is delayed
- Through ticketing to Marlborough
- Improved bus link with Marlborough
- Ticket sellers on more trains
- Proper passenger counting so we appear in our correct position in the station league table
- Improved station waiting areas
- Improved station screen, helpline and PA announcements. Plus the same to be installed on the westbound platform

Rationale

Reading is a very important junction but Westbury also has an importance which we feel is not being fully utilised particularly with regards to stations to the east on the 'Berks and Hants' line.

Extension of some Paddington to Bedwyn semi-fast services on to Westbury has been put forward before. BTPG would welcome this providing that it does not result in a reduction of service for Bedwyn as proposed in the original draft December 2006 timetable. This would be a big boost for Newbury which, for the size of the town, has a poor service with the West of England.

It is the opinion of BTPG that this RUS gives the perfect opportunity to improve services, connectivity and journey possibilities for most stations on the 'Berks and Hants' line at comparatively little extra cost and with only minor changes to the current timetable.

It is assumed that the current paths particularly between Bedwyn and Paddington would be broadly maintained. It is also assumed that services will continue to be operated by 165/166 'Turbos' and HSTs.

The proposed timetable is very much based on the current one which, with a few exceptions seems to be working well. Whilst BTPG does not have inside knowledge we feel that our proposed timetable is workable and could be run with very little, if any additional stock requirements.

There are several sizeable places on the 'Berks and Hants' line including Newbury, which has a poor off-peak service to the West Country, Thatcham, Hungerford and Marlborough (through a designated bus link to Bedwyn). If a timetable such as this was adopted the feasibility of travel to and from the west country would be established for almost all stations on this line.

The main ideas behind this proposal are:

- 1) To increase connectivity for 'Kennet Valley' stations to the West Country
- 2) To have a West Country morning commuter service, using the Reading to Westbury line, for Reading, Theale, Thatcham, Newbury, Kintbury, Hungerford, Bedwyn and Pewsey. This service will open up the possibility to commute to Exeter, Taunton, Westbury, Trowbridge, Bath, Bristol and Salisbury
- 3) Jacobs Consulting originally proposed extension of two additional Paddington - Bedwyn off-peak semi-fast trains to/from Exeter St. David's, Taunton or Bristol Temple Meads. We would suggest the Taunton option as good onward connections are available. In the original proposal Newbury - Bedwyn connections would run. As SDO now operates we would suggest stops at Bedwyn, Hungerford and Kintbury are included. This would then remove the need for the additional Turbo shuttles.
- 4) To place Bedwyn and Hungerford on the same peak hour stopping patterns such that Bedwyn is still the railhead for Marlborough
- 5) To rectify the problem of Bedwyn, Kintbury and Hungerford not having a suitable weekday train for a typical working day in Reading
- 6) Through popular demand to introduce a weekday service, starting 0735, from Bedwyn to London Paddington
- 7) Through popular demand to introduce a new 1854 Paddington departure to serve Reading, Thatcham, Theale, Kintbury, Hungerford and Bedwyn
- 8) Our proposed late trains to and from Westbury could make it possible to provide a unit to operate a local service such as Westbury to Swindon via Melksham.

Notes:

- A New service Paddington to Exeter St. David's following the standard semi-fast stopping pattern between Paddington and Bedwyn, then as shown to Exeter including a stop at Frome. In addition to providing a much earlier service for Taunton and Exeter this would make commuting possible from Kennet valley stations to towns such as Trowbridge, Bath, Bristol and Salisbury.
- B 10.18 Paddington to Bedwyn becomes HST operated and is extended on to Taunton arriving at 12.49. An additional stop could be made at Frome.
- C Consideration could be given to rationalize the stopping pattern on the 11.06 Paddington to Plymouth. In any event this train provides onward connections for the previous service at Taunton.
- D 13.18 Paddington to Bedwyn is extended on to Westbury, calling at Pewsey .
- E 14.18 Paddington to Bedwyn becomes HST operated and runs as per the 10.18 to Taunton with the same stopping pattern.
- F 15.06 Paddington to Penzance as per note C.
- G Additional semi-fast turbo service from Paddington to Bedwyn at 18.54. This train would be overtaken by the 19.03 Paddington to Penzance at Reading.

- I Additional semi-fast train from Paddington, dep 21.06 running through to Westbury, arr 22.48.

- A Bedwyn and Kintbury stops inserted in current 6.08 Westbury to Paddington HST, retimed as 06.00 from Westbury. 06.23 Bedwyn to Reading cut back to Newbury, dep 06.40.
- B New 07.35 turbo service from Bedwyn to Paddington running semi-fast to Reading. Then joins up with the 07.22 Oxford to Paddington at Reading arriving Paddington at 08.59.
- C Westbound 06.18 from Paddington returns as 10.03 from Exeter St. David's with the same stopping pattern. This would form a useful connection to the Penzance to Paddington train arriving Exeter St. David's at 09.57.
- D Possible additional service from Westbury to Paddington at 11.56, turbo operated.
- E 10.18 Paddington to Taunton HST returns from Taunton, dep 13.35 arriving at Paddington at 16.08. This provides a connection to the Penzance to Paddington train arriving Taunton at 13.30.
- F Extended 13.18 Paddington to Westbury train returns from Westbury at 15.12 with usual semi-fast stopping pattern. Connects with Penzance to Paddington train arriving at Westbury at 15.03.
- G The alternate of stopping at Bedwyn (c.f. Hungerford) would be appropriate if the next Bedwyn Turbo departure were regarded as a connecting service for Hungerford and Kintbury.
- H HST
- I 14.18 Paddington to Taunton HST returns from Taunton, dep 17.35 arriving at Paddington at 20.08. This provides a connection with the Penzance to Paddington train arriving at Taunton at 17.30.
- J Additional Bedwyn to Reading semi-fast dep Bedwyn at 20.37. This is return working of 18.54 Paddington to Bedwyn. Note the 20.37 Bedwyn departure will only run if the 18.54 Paddington departure terminates at Bedwyn.

Paddington – Exeter and Exeter – Paddington. Sunday

Due to the complex nature of the Sunday timetable, (numerous variations, long periods of engineering work, replacement buses etc), we have not produced a specific timetable. Currently there is virtually no connectivity for Kennet Valley stations to the west. For instance, returning from the west to Bedwyn, Hungerford or Kintbury requires changing at Newbury followed by a wait of up to two hours. This makes a Sunday journey, to and from the west, for Kintbury, Hungerford and Bedwyn very unattractive. Therefore we'd suggest a mid afternoon westbound train to call at Kintbury, Hungerford and Bedwyn. Additionally a mid evening train to call at these stations from the west.
